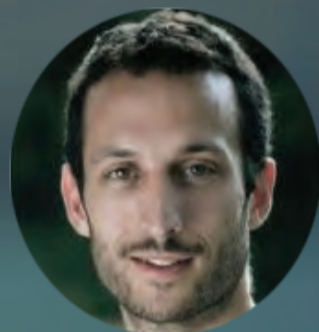
Alexandra Lutz

Josef Mantl is a lecturer at the Vienna University of Applied Sciences for Management and Communication and deputy head of the institute "go governance - upgrading our democratic culture", founder of the sustainability initiative "Sustainable Future Campaign". Six years later, this initiative culminated in the training of Josef Mantl as "Climate Leader" by Al Gore and the founding of the "Green Tech Bridge USA - Austria" with a presentation to Congressman Joseph Kennedy III.

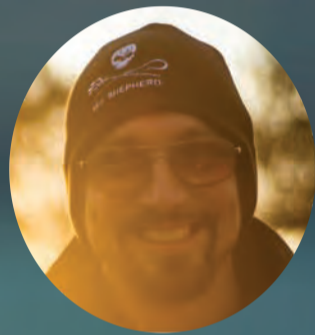
Global 2000

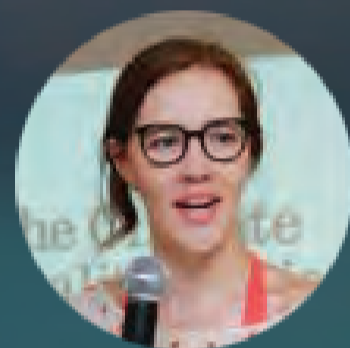
